Izcalli In Nanantzin

In the Nahuatl language translates into the "The Resurgence of our Mother Earth". We were formed as a group in 19881 in Taos New Mexico, In 1990 the group traveled to Queretaro, Mexico and received a estandarte, that recognized as a Traditional Aztec dance group. The banner depicts "Senor Santiago de los Cuatro Vientos (the four directions). Our group belongs to a larger group in Mexico called a Mesa or Alter. We follow the traditions and culture of our Mesa, our Caption and his family are several generations of this lineage. When we dance in Mexico we dance for 3 1/2 days and participate with about 1,000.00 or more dancers. When we dance we honor the four directions our ancestors the future generations our Madre Tierra, the water, animals, and the winged birds. This is a living thriving culture that has coexisted for more then 500 years and continues to unlock the mysteries of our universe, cosmos through each dance step. We have also had the honor of dancing at the Museum of Natural History in 1987 in New York City and gave a workshop at the Peoples Center.



BK Taiko

BK Taiko's performances are exciting and inspiring - a blend of martial arts choreography and synchronized team drumming. The Albuquerque based Taiko School & performance group led by Anita Lee Gallegos, shares the Art of Taiko by performing throughout New Mexico, touring several cities every year.

They also share the Joy of Taiko with hundreds of school children every year through Taiko Lecture demonstrations in New Mexico schools.

Catalina Rio Fernandez

AGALU

“Spirit of the Drums & Dance” Cultural Troupe of Nigeria

Akeem Ayanniyi leads Agalu. The “Ayan” prefix of Akeem’s name Ayanniyi, indicates that he descends from a family lineage that can be traced back 700 years to the Yoruba deity of drumming, Ayan Agula. As the ninth generation of his family to play the traditional Yoruba talking drum, Akeem, who’s from the Western Nigerian town of Erin Oshun near the historic art center of Oshogbo, has been performing since the age of five and has toured much of Africa, as well as Germany, Brazil, Sweden, and the United States as a performer and teacher. He settled in Santa Fe, New Mexico, in 1993 and founded Agalu in 1998.

Tunde Ojeyemi, who is also from Erin Oshun, has toured through the U.S., Europe and Japan. Tunde electrifies audiences with his mastery of bata, the “thunder drums” associated with the Yoruba Orisha, deity of thunder and lightning.

Ayo Adeyemi was born in Ijebu, Nigeria where he was initiated as a babalawo in the indigenous Yoruba religion, Ifa. He is a master of djembe and djun djun who has been drumming, singing, and dancing since he was a child. In the 1980’s, Ayo, whose name means “happy,” came to America where he lived and toured with renowned Yoruba master drummer Babtunde Olantunji for eight years. In the 1990’s, Ayo was proprietor of Yoruba House in West Los Angeles. Today, he is touring with Agalu to offer his music and teachings to a wider audience. As a vocalist, Ayo rouses audiences when he joyously sings the praises of the Yoruba deities.

Guest performers from Nigeria often join the Agula ensemble.
